The National Library of Wales is firmly of the opinion that, in the spirit of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, all public records should be open to public access, unless subject to one of the exemptions contained in the Act. Government records should be treated no differently than any other public records, and should be opened to public access at the time of transfer to TNA, unless an exemption is applicable.

Moving forward in this way would be to the benefit of any members of the public, the media or the research community wanting information from these records. Originating departments should identify any records to which an exemption might be applied, but should be aware that, in the case of qualified exemptions, a public interest test might need to be applied if a request for information was made.
